<b>1</b>	acronym for a group of sexual minorities including lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning and intersex individuals	<b>12</b>	a person’s expression of their gender identity, including appearance, dress, mannerisms, speech, and social interactions
<b>2</b>	a socially constructed concept classifying behavior as either “masculine” or “feminine,” unrelated to one’s external genitalia	<b>13</b>	sexual or romantic attraction to a sex differing from one’s own
<b>3</b>	a person whose gender identity differs from their birth sex	<b>14</b>	commonly refers to men typically attracted to other men
<b>4</b>	commonly refers to women typically attracted to other women	<b>15</b>	the sex that a person sees themselves as. This can include refusing to label oneself with a sex
<b>5</b>	romantic and/or physical attraction to members of the same or different sex	<b>16</b>	a person whose birth sex was female but who understands himself to be, and desires to live his life as, a male
<b>6</b>	a person who is romantically or sexually attracted to more than one gender or sexual category	<b>17</b>	conduct that is not normatively associated with an individual’s biological sex
<b>7</b>	a condition in which a person is born with external genitalia, internal reproductive organs, chromosome patterns, and/or an endocrine system that does not fit typical definitions of male or female	<b>18</b>	one’s anatomical make-up, including external genitalia, chromosomes, and reproductive system
<b>8</b>	active process in which a person explores her or his own sexual orientation and/or gender identity and questions the cultural assumptions that they are heterosexual and/or gender conforming	<b>19</b>	gender characteristics and/or behaviors that do not conform to those typically associated with a person’s biological sex
<b>9</b>	the expectations associated with “masculine” or “feminine” conduct, based on how society commonly believes males and females should behave	<b>20</b>	a person who is not romantically or sexually attracted to any gender
<b>10</b>	a person whose birth sex was male but who understands herself to be, and desires to live her life as, a female	<b>21</b>	sexual, emotional, and/or romantic attraction to persons of the same sex
<b>11</b>	distinct from sexual orientation and refers to a person’s internal, deeply felt sense of being male or female
